

Counterpoint

In "An Unholy Act" [September], Jesse Katz writes that I am "hawkish" and that my articles are often "bellicose." In reality, I have merely pointed out that Israel remains under fierce armed attack, that it is the target of a massive propaganda war as well, that anti-Semitism remains rife in the world, and that Jews continue to be imperiled everywhere. These are simply facts that no one who reads the daily and weekly newspapers, especially the leading Israeli and American Jewish ones, can dispute.

Mr. Katz asserts that Israel is being oppressive. Israel has actually displayed remarkable restraint and even generosity toward its enemies despite 60 years of unrelenting war initiated against it. For example, when Israel began its "occupation" of Judea, Samaria, and Gaza in 1967, these regions had no university. Now they have 20! The standard of living of the Palestinian Arabs rose dramatically during the Israeli "occupation" between 1967 and 1994, in spite of frequent terrorist attacks on Israelis by Palestinian Arabs. It began to decline only when Israel unwisely transferred control over the Palestinian areas to the Fatah, Hamas, and other terrorist factions.

Mr. Katz's assertion, which he also depicts as the view of Rabbi Seidler-Feller, that the Jewish people "thrived" for 2,000 years without a state, is false. During those 2,000 years, Jews endured the killing of over 1 million of their people and the enslavement of millions more by imperial Rome, innumerable pogroms in both the Christian and Muslim countries between roughly 350 C.E. and (in the case of the Muslim world) as late as 1967, the Spanish Inquisition, mass expulsions, forced segregation, legal discrimination, and finally the Nazi extermination that claimed the lives of one-third of the world's Jews. Some Jews have somehow survived these persecutions. To assert that Jews have thrived during these centuries of persecution considerably overstates the case.

Mr. Katz's equating the word "kapo" with the notorious "N word," used to insult


